Operations Center On Schedule

Construction is moving forward and over the next few weeks the building exterior will be completed along with paving and relocation of the rotating beacon tower. The interior walls have been framed and radiant floor heating in the hangar completed. By mid October all exterior work will be completed and construction crews will be working inside so the airport can occupy the building on schedule at the end of November.



Pilots and passengers will be pleased with the expanded space and upgraded amenities available with the new facility.

The centerpiece of the new operations center is the attached 80' X 85' hangar which will allow multiple storage scenarios for aircraft owners and operators. The large 70' X 20' bi-fold door will accommodate every single and twin engine piston aircraft and the vast majority of medium sized jets.

The Logansport/Cass County Airport Authority plans to host a grand opening during the spring of 2009 at which time it will kick off a year long "50th Anniversary Celebration" of the airport. Stay tuned to the airports website and coming Flight Lines newsletters for more information.

As I mentioned in the 2nd quarter Flight Lines newsletter, the Logansport/Cass County Airport offered the lowest price on 100LL in a 50 mile radius. I am happy to

report that we continue to be the low cost leader for 100LL in the north central Indiana region. According to the September 29 AirNav listing the price range for a gallon of 100LL in the region is \$4.70 to \$5.93, with the average being \$5.21. Our current price of \$4.70 is 51 cents below the average. Although no one can say where fuel prices are going, you can be assured that we will continue to be the low cost leader with a commitment to providing first class customer service.
